Dear staff, parents, and carers,

Further to the 10 March 2026 notification outlined below, we will also be conducting tree removal work.

On Saturday 28 March 2026 a qualified contractor will be conducting tree removal works, weather permitting. Removal is necessary in this case to enable access for the planned work to take place.

A total of 2 trees along the shared boundary fence near Olive Crescent and Milford Road will be removed and work will be completed within a day.

Dear staff, parents, carers and neighbours,

We are making improvements to the stormwater system at Peakhurst Public School. This work will be completed along the shared boundary fence near Olive Crescent and Milford Road between Monday 30 March and Monday 27 April 2026.

What to expect during construction

Temporary fencing will be installed along the northern fence boundary to isolate the construction area so the pipes and stormwater pits can be upgraded.

Work hours are 7 am to 3.30 pm Monday to Saturday as per local council guidelines.

The Out of School Hours (OOSH) and vacation care service which operates out of Attunga Hall (Building M) will not be affected by this work. OOSH services will run as usual during this period which includes the autumn school holidays.

Working with asbestos-containing materials

As part of the stormwater improvements, we will be excavating and removing soil containing bonded asbestos fragments in an area listed on the School Asbestos Management Plan.



NSW Health explains that “living or working with asbestos, or just being around it, is a low risk to your health as long as the asbestos is in good condition and not damaged”.

Safety measures will be in place during the work including air monitoring, signage and workers wearing personal protective equipment.

All work involving asbestos-containing materials will be completed by licensed asbestos contractors in accordance with work health and safety laws and the NSW Department of Education’s Asbestos Management Plan.

The health, safety and wellbeing of all members of our school and the local community are our highest priorities.
