## Investing in our schools

As part of the NSW Government’s plan to rebuild public education, the NSW Budget is delivering \$2.1 billion for new and upgraded schools in regional NSW. This targeted investment will ensure growing communities get access to a world class public education.

### Project overview

This project involves the refurbishment of student toilet facilities in Building B at Spring Hill Public School to improve functionality for students and staff. The project will deliver:



refurbished student toilets



updated lining and tiling



installation of a new staff unisex ambulant toilet



refurbished roof

## Progress summary

Building B toilet refurbishment work began on Monday 6 August 2025 with the new facilities expected to be in use from Monday 24 November 2025 weather permitting. Construction work is being completed Monday to Friday from 7 am to 4 pm and on Saturdays from 7 am to 12 pm. No work is being carried out on Sundays or public holidays.

Temporary toilet facilities are available near the administration building for student use while the refurbishment work is taking place.

## Asbestos related information

The eaves and ceiling sheets within the toilet facilities in Building B area were known to contain bonded asbestos as per the school's asbestos register.

Removal of bonded asbestos was completed between Thursday 14 August and Saturday 16 August 2025. All work involving asbestos-containing materials took place outside of school hours.

All work was done in accordance with work health and safety laws and the NSW Department of Education's Asbestos Management Plan. Safety measures were in place while work was being done. All work was completed by licensed asbestos contractors and inspected by an independent hygienist. A clearance certificate was issued on Sunday 17 August 2025 to confirm the area had been fully remediated before the area was reopened for construction works.
