

Windellama Public School

Works notification | 4 May 2023

Dear staff and parents/carers,

Drinking water quality testing was recently conducted at Windellama Public School as part of planned maintenance.

Findings have detected some copper and lead above acceptable levels, and some bacteria in samples collected from an external tap of one of the school's water tanks. Testing has also detected lead above acceptable levels from the bubblers in Block D.

Precautionary safety measures have been put in place to ensure there is no risk to students, staff or the local community. This includes restricting access to the tap and bubblers and the installation of signage to warn users not to drink the water.

As there has been no material detected elsewhere, drinking water can continue to be available for use from the school's remaining usage points. This is in line with the independent occupational hygienist advice. Bottled water will be supplied as an alternative for staff and students as needed.

School Infrastructure NSW will now work with the independent occupational hygienist and the school to undertake any remediation work required. All work will be carried out by qualified contractors and School Infrastructure NSW will undertake additional testing at the school following the work to ensure the water is safe for use.

The health and safety of students and staff is the priority for the school and the NSW Department of Education. Department staff will continue working closely with NSW Health and the school leadership, to keep you updated on this matter.
