Facility upgrades and enhancements at Kellyville Ridge Public School are underway.

Progress overview

In partnership with the school's Parents and Citizens' Association, multiple key projects have progressed:



Positive behaviour for learning signage (PBL)

Installation of PBL signage located around the school site.

Status: Completed

Following our update in [August 2025](#), we are pleased to share that the playground upgrades have progressed from planning into the construction phase. The playground upgrades will contain:



Installation of inground mini trampolines and construction of a raised car track



Development of active play features, including a climbing wall, bridge, and connecting tunnels



Creation of a raised digging and sand play area, stepping stone pathways, and a circular learning space



Integration of gardens to form natural play areas, along with installation of softfall and synthetic grass around equipment

Progress summary

Construction works for the playground upgrades between building D and Building F started on Monday 30 March 2026, the work is expected to be completed in Term 2 2026. Construction activities will take place during the April holidays.

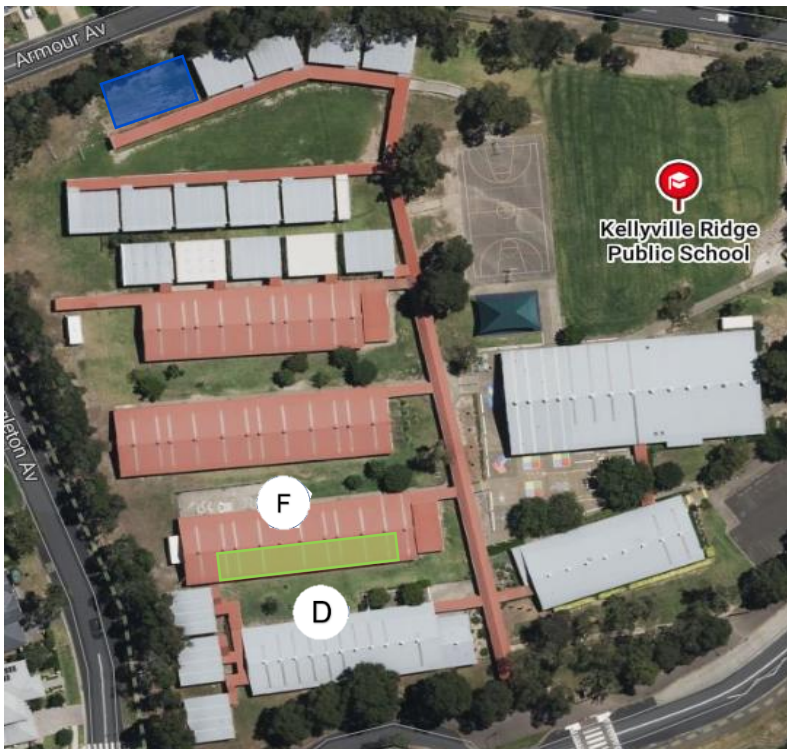
There will be no impact to Out of School Hours (OOSH) and vacation care service which will continue to operate as usual during the holidays.


