Junee High School Community update | 23 September 2024

Dear staff, parents and carers,

We are writing to let you know about the appointment of a construction contractor to lead the rebuild of Junee High School's fire-damaged agriculture building.

Construction company Irons Builders Pty Ltd will demolish the structure and remove its concrete slab during the upcoming Spring School Holidays.

The removal of bonded asbestos-containing material, as listed in the school's asbestos register, will take place from 7 October to Thursday 10 October.

NSW Health explains if bonded asbestos is mixed with cement or other hard bonding materials, and in good condition, it is likely to be low risk.

Safety measures will be in place and all work will be done in accordance with work, health and safety laws and the NSW Department of Education's Asbestos Management Plan.

All asbestos removal work will be completed by licensed and accredited asbestos contractors and monitored by independent hygienists in strict accordance with all applicable legislation, regulations, policies, and guidelines.

Following the completion of the above works, a new concrete slab will be poured early in Term 4 2024.

Rebuilding work will continue throughout Term 4, including building retaining walls, constructing a frame, internal plastering and connecting electricity and plumbing.

The construction zone will remain fenced off and inaccessible throughout.

The new agriculture building is scheduled to be operational for Day 1 Term 1 2025.
