

Scone High School

Works notification | 10 March 2026

Dear staff, parents, carers and neighbours,

We are delivering an upgrade to the entrance at Scone High School by building a new covered entry.

This project started in January 2026 and will continue during terms 1 and 2, including the upcoming autumn school holidays.

The upgraded footpath is due to be finished by Day 1, Term 2 2026 weather permitting.

Temporary changes to footpath access

To ensure the safety of the school community we temporarily closed a section of the footpath along on Gundy Road between gates 3 and 5 that lead into the school. From Monday 9 March 2026 the footpath has been temporarily filled with blue metal until further work resumes next week.

The Gundy Road footpath will remain closed on one side of the road from Monday 16 March 2026 with pedestrian signage in place.

Gates 3 and 5 will be available, however pedestrians are directed to use the opposite footpath to access the school along Gundy Road.

Changes to student drop off and pick up zones

Gates 3 and 5 will remain open for school drop off and pick up while this project is being delivered.

Parents and carers travelling along Gundy Road from the **west** should use **Gate 3**. Those travelling from the **east** should use **Gate 5**.

Gate 3 will not be available outside of drop off and pick up times. Please use available street parking across Gundy Road or east of Gate 5 while Gate 3 is unavailable and follow the signs to the footpaths.
