The health, safety, and wellbeing of all members of our school and the local community are our highest priorities.

As outlined in [10 March 2026](#) notification, we are upgrading the landscaping and front entry of Building A at Scone High School.

Today, during these works, an unexpected outage caused a loss of power to the school.

A temporary generator was immediately installed to service the administration and canteen buildings. The school assembly scheduled for today will be rescheduled. The school will keep you updated on the new assembly date once more information is available.

Urgent repairs have been arranged for Saturday 21 and Sunday 22 March to restore power to the school before Monday 23 March 2026.

The landscaping and upgrade project will continue throughout the school holidays and is on track to be finished by mid-term 2, 2026.
