Dear staff, parents, carers and neighbours,

As part of the NSW Government's plan to rebuild public education, a project is underway to construct 3 cricket pitches at Girraween High School.

The planning pathway for this project, the Review of Environmental Factors (REF) has been approved, allowing for construction to start.

Start of construction

The construction of the cricket pitches on the oval near the front car park will start from Friday 24 April 2026. Works will offer students the opportunity to play and compete on 3 brand new cricket pitches.

The project includes:

- site establishment, that is, setting up a secure construction site and establish materials handling area
- installation of 3 cricket pitches
- air monitoring and dust control.

All work will be completed by the start of Term 3 2026.

Construction vehicles will enter the school via Gilba Rd. Traffic control will be used if required for the safety of students, staff and the local community. Please follow the directions of any temporary signage and traffic controllers when in place.

Managing construction impacts

The safety of the school, visitors and the local community is our highest priority. We are committed to minimising disruptions where possible while work is taking place.
